COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

<u>Basic/Advanced Forcible Entry (12 hours)</u> - 12 minimum 24 max; Spend an evening reviewing the basics and mechanics of forcible entry, then practicing familiar and learning more advanced techniques the next day. PPE/Gloves/Eye Protection required.

<u>Basic/Advanced Ground Ladders (12 hours)</u> - 12 minimum 24 max; Spend an evening reviewing the basics and operations of ground ladders, then practicing familiar and learning more advanced techniques the next day. PPE/Gloves/required.

<u>Live Fire Operations (10 hours)</u> - 8 minimum 16 max; Spend an evening with a Live Fire Briefing, then perform fire attack operations the next day in the MFSI Live Fire Training Trailer. PPE/SCBA/Spare Cylinder required. <u>NOTE: the Maine Respiratory Protection Statute will be strictly enforced.</u>

<u>Basic Pump Operators Course (16 Hours)</u> - 6 minimum 8 max; Basic pump component identification & operation, hydraulic calculations, and flowing water from as little as a single hose line, up to 500 gpm via multiple hose lines, along with basic relay pumping. <u>NOTE: This class MAY start Friday evening May 17 at 1800</u>.

NFA: Incident Safety Officer (ISO F729) (16 hours) - 12 min /24 max; this course examines the incident safety officer's role within the command structure at emergency response situations. Participants will be able to identify and analyze incident scene safety concerns and communicate recommended solutions to the command authority.

Maine Fire Chief's Association Workshop (16 hours) - 12 min /24 max; The Maine Fire Chiefs Association and the Maine Fire Service Institute have collaborated to create the Maine Fire Chiefs Workshop. The workshop was created with a goal to provide current, new and aspiring fire chiefs with an understanding of important considerations for the delivery of fire protection services in their community. The workshop will provide information to assist in the management and leadership of a fire department in Maine.

Topics include: Legal Aspects, Professionalism and Politics, Fire Chiefs Role in Leading, Financial Management and Planning, Fire Chiefs Role in Coaching, Counseling and Correcting, Incident Management, Training Safety and Risk Management, Community and Media Relations.
