1. Application Acceptance from Pro-Board


MFSI has been granted approval to move forward with the new and updated NFPA 1041 Fire & Emergency Service Instructor Professional Qualifications 2019 Edition. The pandemic slowed our ability to make this happen sooner, but with teamwork and perseverance we got it done. Now we are moving forward with step two: Live Fire Training Instructor and Instructor In charge. The goal is to better prepare those that take on the task of training safely with live fire evolutions.

2. New Financial Liaison (Accountant I)

As most are aware, longtime MFSI employee Melissa Turner stepped away from her role in late May. We needed to move fast given this time of year to get this key position filled as we are not only in the busy season for fire training, but also the flip of the Fiscal year. We have hired on a temporary basis Ms. Nancy Russell - Nancy brings more than 30 years of experience to the role, and is a Financial Analysis and Budget Manager at Bowdoin College, one of the most prestigious post-secondary colleges in New England. Her experience and abilities are far reaching and she will surely make a great addition to our team. Nancy will be working to improve all aspects of our finances and assist in producing reports to show where MFSI spends it funds to better our state's fire service.

3. Advanced Fire Officer Program

We are offering a few Advanced Fire Officer Programs to assist the folks that have attended the Basic Fire Officer programming in prior years. In the fire training world, the standards typically change every five years with this change in standard comes a change in the Pro-Board processes. The old NFPA 1021 Standard on Professional Fire Officer Qualifications is coming to an end and the new standard will come with a new updated curriculum. We will be moving away from the Basic Fire Officer/Advanced Fire Officer model, to ensure we stand up to our Pro-Board Certification, and introducing a Fire Officer I for the Maine State Fire Service. This valuable program will help us better meet the current demand we're seeing in the field around the state.




4. MFSI Supply & Demand

The administration feels that one of our top priorities is customer service. Currently, we are down two full-time staff members, one of which, the Certification Manger position, is especially key during skills and written test season. We are doing our best to meet demand in Peter's absence and while operating under the current COVID 19 guidance. We assure you, we are doing all we can to get exam scores out and subsequent certificates printed. Please be patient as we get these time consuming tasks behind us.



5. SMCC/MFSI Advisory

We met with the SMCC/MFSI Advisory Committee via Zoom videoconferencing on June 4th. The meeting was very well attended by our professional guidance committee and the result was a productive discussion. The most dynamic portion of the meeting was the review and official adoption of the SMCC/MFSI Strategic Plan. We are very proud of this document and hope to fulfill all its goals over the next few years. Ultimately, the end goal is to create a well operating system within MFSI in all of our four divisions to meet the ever changing fire service in Maine. Maine Fire Service Institute (MFSI) is a statewide agency that covers all 35,385 square miles of Maine. Candidates for the position of MFSI State Fire Instructor will be chosen based on their qualifications as well as their ability to cover underserved geographic regions.

Position Responsibilities:

The successful State Fire Instructor must: Maintain current knowledge and understanding of fire service related mateirals; Perform, demonstrate, and explain current skills and abilities of the trade; Provide safe, effective, and efficient fire service training to Maine's firefighters; Enhance the safety and abilities of Maine's firefighters through context-based training;

Attend periodic MFSI Instructor Meetings; Represent themselves, MFSI & Maine's fire service professionally and positively, practicing within an MFSI-adopted "Code of Ethics."

Minimum Requirements:

- •Certified Fire Fighter I & II
- Certified Fire Instructor I & II
- Minimum of 5 years verifiable, proactive fire service experience
- Certificates in Basic Pumps & EVOC (preferred)

Hiring Process:

- Submit Letter of Intent, resume, and 3 professional references
- Written Exam, based on Fire Fighter I
 & II and Fire Instructor I curricula
- Practical skills review
- Physical Wellness Assessment

- Interview
- ·Background check
- Probation period (12 months)
- Mandatory attendance at the MFSI Fire Instructor Academy

MFSI will be accepting letters of intent and resumes for the position of State Fire Instructor (part-time) from July 1 - July 31, 2021.
