SMCC-MFSI ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING

The meeting was held on December 8th at MFSI HQ in Brunswick, with many committee members stakeholders in attendance. One topic discussed was the use of MFSI fire training trailers (EDVT) for private ambulance services. The committee voted to stop this practice as these assets are only intended for municipal fire departments' use. MFSI will let folks know that requests for these props for private ambulance services will be denied. As a compromise, we have some spare cones that can be borrowed and utilized. MFSI cannot incur costs associated with operations outside our core mission. This was voted on and passed unanimously.

SMCC-MFSI TO FOCUS ON FIRE TRAINING MODEL

After many years of operating under the current fire training model, it is time for a professional review to see where improvements can be made to meet the demand of the fire service today. The committee voted to support the formation of a focus group on fire training to establish parameters to our operations across Maine and continue to implement the 2021-25 strategic plan. The focus group will review all aspects of MFSI operations, programs and delivery models to see where we can make incremental adjustments to make things better for the state's fire service. The focus group will begin in January/February 2024.



This issue is dedicated to the 84 fire service professionals that lost their lives in the line of duty in 2023 across the United States. These men and women shall never be forgotten, and we will continue to honor their sacrifices for eternity. 2023 CERTIFICATIONS

MFSI is currently in the application process for our Pro Board reaccreditation and is making updates to our Certification Policy & Procedures Manual. Once finished, we will complete the extensive application process and submit accordingly, then await a response from Pro Board. We anticipate that this submission will be completed sometime during the month of January, well in advance of the June 2024 deadline.

In addition, two members from the Certification team will be attending the annual Pro Board conference in January to support site visit preparation and network with other state and certification agencies.

LIVE FIRE INSTRUCTOR & INSTRUCTOR-IN-CHARGE

MFSI held a very successful program in Bangor in late October. The group of fire service professionals seemed to be very engaged and enjoyed the program. We have begun planning a program for Fall 2024, proposed in Scarborough with burns held at Yarmouth's fire training facility. Dates and times to be confirmed.



We are working on a "frequency of delivery model" for the five largest populated counties. We want to get into a rhythm for planning purposes. More to come on this in the future. Meanwhile we will try and deliver three programs per year as long as the budget can support them with ease.

FIRE OFFICER I

Fire Officer I is completely full in Waterville and we are offering a second program in Brewer to meet the demand. Another program in 2024 will be offered in York/Cumberland County.

FIRE OFFICER II

Planning is underway for a late spring 2024 FO-II to be set up as an academy - a four-day residential program at the University of Maine in Farmington. A survey went out to recent graduates of FO-I to inquire about what program model to use. Of the 54 respondents, 55% voted for academy and 47% for weekend. 48% of respondents listed Firefighter as their current rank.


LITHIUM-ION AWARENESS & EV FIRE TRAINING

MAINE FIRE PROTECTION COMMISSION & MFSI

Regional Firefighter Grant Program
Several programs have come to a close for 2024 and a handful are accepting applications for a January start. This program is currently under review by the Maine Fire Protection Commission.

Regional Live Fire Training Facility Grant Program - With recent funding we will be planning and preparing the 2024 Live Fire Training Grant Process. The funds will not start coming in until after July 2024, thus we will plan to award perhaps late Fall of 2024. More information to follow. We are so very fortunate to be able to potentially provide two or three more facilities regionally in Maine for fire training purposes.



TRAIN-THE-TRAINER



MFSI held a State Fire Instructor Workshop and training our instructors was the priority on many new props and equipment. As identified in the damage to equipment, MFSI will embark on a scheduled state and municipal fire instructor training on our new equipment. The first round of Train-the-Trainers will be scheduled this winter and spring on the new Red SCBA Air Management maze.


