Fire & Emergency Services Instructor I/II

Attendance is mandatory for all sessions. This program is conducted partially via Zoom. Please note that dates and times are subject to change.

A portion of the **program fee** (\$100) will still be invoiced for participants who withdraw after the second class (January 24, 2024). The registration fee includes a copy of the Jones & Bartlett textbook. The J&B Exam Prep Book can be provided on a loan basis to students by request.

The Peter L. Rines Memorial Scholarship may be available for qualifying students. Please contact MFSI Director Jim Graves (207-844-2078 or jgraves@mainecc.edu for more information about how to apply. The intent of the Peter L. Rines scholarship is to provide financial assistance to Maine fire/rescue department members to help facilitate their attendance at a Maine Fire Service Institute Fire Instructor Program or Fire Officer Program/Academy. Priority will be given to those applicants from resource deprived communities and fire departments facing financial barriers to attendance. Any member in good standing of a Maine Fire Department holding the necessary prerequisite certifications may apply for the program desired. The application shall include a cover letter briefly stating intent and financial need, personal goals in the fire service and anticipated community/fire service benefits. A completed application form with the Fire Chief's endorsement is also required.

Course description: This 60+/- hour course is designed to meet or exceed requirements of the Maine EMS identified standards for courses that lead to licensure for Instructor Coordinators, as well as the NFPA 1041 standard for Fire & Emergency Services Instructor I & II Professional Qualifications. Class time is spent on instructor roles, audience analysis, communication skills, the writing of objectives, simulations, and evaluation methods. Each student is required to prepare and deliver both a 10-minute and a 20-minute classroom presentation. This course is an advanced level of education and requires the use of a laptop or computer and access to the internet, with assignments to be completed online.

Recognition/Credit & Preferred Prerequisites: All students who successfully complete the course will receive a certificate of completion as meeting the NFPA 1041 standard for Fire & Emergency Services Instructor I & II Professional Qualifications. This course is designed for both Fire & EMS staff. For fire service members, the preferred prerequisites are: NFPA Fire Fighter I and II and 3 years of fire service experience. For EMS personnel, the preferred prerequisite is 3 years of emergency services experience. Please click here to view additional details about credit and reciprocity for EMS personnel. This document was produced by the Maine Bureau of EMS, and applies primarily to Fire & EMS Instructor I & II candidates who are interested in obtaining a Maine EMS Instructor Coordinator license.
