TRAINING OPERATIONS IN SMALL DEPARTMENTS

This 2-day National Fire Academy course is designed to provide students with some basic tools and skills to coordinate training in a small fire and emergency medical services organization. A training function in a smaller department may include conducting training drills and coordinating training with a nearby larger city or state training function.

Designed for: Fire and rescue personnel who coordinate training in small departments. Volunteer firefighters and officers who instruct in small fire and rescue departments. Fire personnel serving on training committees. Training officers in volunteer fire departments.

- Selecting/evaluating training curricula and materials from outside sources
