HISTORY & GOVERNANCE AUTHORITY

The Maine State Legislature created Maine Fire Service Training in 1948 in response to the fires that burned across the state in 1947. This new organization was dedicated to the training of fire fighters, and has seen many changes over the years.

In the early 1980's, Maine Fire Training & Education, a non-academic program of what was then known as Southern Maine Technical College, initiated certification programs for fire fighters, fire instructors and fire officers. Through the 1980's and 1990's, MFT&E offered Fire Fighter I & II training and certification based on the 1982, 1987 and 1992 editions of NFPA 1001 Standard for Fire Fighter Professional Qualifications. In 1992, MFT&E, introduced a Fire Fighter I & II training program designed to comply with the National Fire Protection Association Standard 1001-1992 Ed. Testing procedures were developed and implemented to certify firefighters to this standard. Over the next few years Fire Officer & Fire Service Instructor were added.

In 2006, MFT&E achieved Pro Board accreditation for the levels of Fire Fighter I & II, Fire Service Instructor I & II and Fire Officer I & II. Reaccreditation also occurred in 2013 and again in 2018 with the addition of Fire Life Safety Educator I.

In 2011, the Maine State Legislature passed legislation that reorganized MFT&E and created the Maine Fire Service Institute as it exists today. In July of 2012, MFSI relocated to the former Brunswick Naval Air Station. With a new name and a new home, MFSI stands ready to continue its mission of assisting in the development of skills and abilities in support of Maine's Fire Service at the local, regional and state level in collaboration with the Fire Chiefs of Maine.





PURPOSE OF MANUAL

The Maine Fire Service Institute understands the need for standardized and contemporary procedures which allow for individuals who may already be fire service professionals from other states to participate in Maine's fire service. There is a need for standardization and agreement amongst the fire training and certification agencies in order to ensure that all members of the fire service are prepared to perform the job requirements safely and successfully.

This packet contains documents to provide helpful information on the steps involved in pursuing certification in Maine. If you already have certification from another state, this packet is intended to condense the information needed for you to get reciprocity on your certificates from Maine.

Many changes have occurred in the certification process since Maine Fire Service Institute was initially accredited by the National Board on Fire Service Professional Qualifications (more commonly referred to as Pro Board) in 2006. We have since received reaccreditation in 2013 and again in 2018.

RECIPROCITY INSTRUCTIONS

Individuals holding certification accredited by the International Fire Service Accreditation Congress (IFSAC), the National Board on Fire Service Professional Qualifications (Pro Board/NBFSPQ), or Department of Defense (DOD) must comply with the following guidelines:

- A. Candidate must submit application materials via <u>mail</u> to MFSI Attn: Reciprocity 19 Sewall Street, Brunswick, ME 04011 OR via <u>email</u> to jroy@mainecc.edu.
- B. Candidate must complete and submit copies of SMCC Registration Form (see page 9) and Reciprocity Form (see page 10) and attach supporting documentation (other documents may be copied).
- C. Certificates must clearly indicate accreditation from IFSAC, NBFSPQ, Pro Board or DOD for the level certification and be verifiable from the accrediting agency.
- D. The candidate must be a member of a Maine Fire Department and must have a letter from the Fire Chief in order to request reciprocity (see page 7).
- E. Candidate must pay a \$10.00 fee for *each* level of Reciprocity Certificate.

The Certification Division will review and verify all documentation. Once documentation has been confirmed to have met the certification criteria, the candidate will be issued reciprocity. If documentation does *not* meet the certification requirements, the candidate will be denied reciprocity. If denied, and the candidate is still seeking certification in Maine, they would be required to complete an approved training program and meet all certification requirements including but not limited to, passing written and practical skills certification exams.

MFSI will not consider certificates issued from local, county or any other non-state agency for reciprocity including academic institutions.
